IELTS Sponsorship

Due to you ignoring 2 emails and a notice on the notice board you lost your IELTS sponsorship.

However, many of you have come to my office to complain. Many of you have thought that Mr. Danh would be sympathetic and would help you, so you by-passed my office altogether! That I find very disrespectful. Many of you say it wasn't clear. Many of you think that you are not at fault.

Let me make something very clear. You are complaining at me because you didn't do something. Either:

1. You didn't come to register.
2. You didn't come to check.
3. You didn't check the notice board.
4. You didn't think it important.
5. You didn't call to clarify meaning.

Against my better judgment, because the above is something you need to learn, I have decided to review the situation. The English department will now run a last mock exam in August (exact date to be announced), the results of which will determine our sponsorship of you.

Conditions:

1. All unregistered students (students not taking the test on July 27th) must attend the mock. **AUT July 3rd 9am / Keuka Aug 7th 9am by this Friday (May 31st)**
2. Students must not be late. The exam door will close 5mins before the start of the exam. Any student who is late will not be allowed in. No exceptions.

3. The above applies also to the speaking test in which student will be given a specific time.
4. Students must achieve an overall score of 6 (no score less than 5.5) in the mock.
5. Students must come and register with Ms Trang their intention to take this mock.

Failure in any of the above conditions will render you ineligible for sponsorship a 2nd time!

Only students who are successful in this mock will have their IELTS sponsorship re-instated.

To save time and labor, student's papers will be marked until such a time as the fail to achieve 5.5 in a certain category. For example, the listening will be marked first. If a student fails to gain 5.5 in this category, their paper will stop being checked.
